A Time to Talk and a Time to Trust

Every year-end, I read by schedule into the "dark realm" of the Minor Prophets with all their confusing language, unknown



symbolisms, and blistering rebukes; and every year I find blessing in the messages of these faithful servants. This year was no exception. ¹

In Habakkuk, a name meaning "to embrace," you find a prophet trying to embrace or understand God and his own circumstances; he does exactly what I would do - ask God questions.

The first question in 1:1-4 is "God, why are you allowing wicked men to prosper in Israel?" Since Israel is God's chosen people, since God hates wickedness, and since God should therefore be dealing with the wicked and is not, "Is God just?" This is the same question we may ask when we hear that another act of terror has claimed innocent life or a natural disaster has destroyed a community. God's answer shocks Habakkuk: "I am going to judge Israel by giving them to the Babylonians." (1:5-11)

This quickly brings a second question in 1:12-2:1: "But God, how can you judge Israel's wickedness with a nation much more wicked than Israel?" Now the question is "Are you fair, God?" Many of us grapple with this especially when bad things happen to us: when we get sick, or a dear one to us is sick, or death takes one from us, or we lose possessions or money. We are tempted to look up and say, "God, is this fair?" Why is that? Most likely, because we see ourselves as essentially good and therefore deserving of God's blessing. Like Habakkuk thought: "We're not as bad as they are!"

Again, God answers Habakkuk's question saying He also will judge Babylon for their wickedness. Case closed. For Habakkuk, his mouth is now closed:

"But the LORD is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him." (2:20)

Although God answers Habakkuk's questions and does not rebuke him for asking (ref. James 1:5), there are times when we must simply trust God rather than asking questions. Listen to Habakkuk's closing prayer of trust:

"Though the fig tree should not blossom, nor fruit be on the vines, the produce of the olive fail, and the fields yield no food...and there be no herd in the stalls, yet will I rejoice in the LORD; I will take joy in the God of my salvation."

We do not know what this new year will bring with it, but Habakkuk reminds us that there are times to talk and there are times simply to trust.

WORSHIPING WITH CHILDREN: TIPS FOR PARENTS

Here at FBC we encourage family worship and ask that children 4 years and older join their families in our worship times. Our goal is for your child to grow in Christ and in their own concept of worship by watching you, their parent, and other believers join together as the body of Christ.

However, it can be challenging at times. Here are some tips for parents and pew moms.

- Prepare ahead of time. Talk about worship at home and how it is important to your family and to God. Make sure children get adequate rest on Saturday evening and breakfast Sunday morning.
- 2) Make sure your child uses the rest room before worship begins. Most children can sit through a regular length service.
- 3) Sit near the front. Children do better when they can see more clearly.
- 4) Be sure to pick up a bulletin and help the child follow along.
- 5) Worship bags are available for preschool/children through grade 3 in the hallway by the elevator.
- 6) Save the activities in the worship bag for the sermon time. Before that show children how to participate in the prayer time, singing time and offering. They learn by doing.
- 7) Take any pages and crafts with you so that you can talk about worship after you get home.
