Week 4 - Remember and Repent

We often treat God as though He can work only from Genesis through Revelation. But God is unchanging in His power and in His ways. He is an eternal, active, and personal God. We are to remember His Awesome works.

Another requirement for us to experience revival is for us to repent of our sins. As we remember how holy and awesome our God is, we remember how sinful and forgetful we can be. This is what Isaiah 64:5-8 is all about.

QUESTIONS for THOUGHT:

- 1) What are some of the mighty works of God that you have seen in your life and in the lives of others?
- 2) To repent is to turn away from our sinful behavior and to start obeying the Lord. If we fail to recognize where we are disobedient to God, then we will not repent. Are you willing to share in your life some behaviors that you need to repent of? How can we pray for each other?

- 3) What did you learn from that experience? How did it help you with future difficulties?
- 4) Is there anything in you life at this moment you are waiting on the Lord for? How can we pray for you as you wait?

Isaiah 64 was written to stir the people of Israel to seek the Lord for revival. Revival is a time to renew our love for God. Revival is a time of sweet fellowship with God. Our church will begin praying this month for a focused time of meeting with God in the month of September. We will be hosting the Life Action Revival team September 27—30.

Read Isaiah 64:1-4

QUESTIONS for THOUGHT:

- 1) What is the request that Isaiah is making in verses 1-2?
- From which direction must revival come (is it prayed up, worked up, or sent down?)
- 3) If a reviving comes, who is the ultimate cause of it?
- 4) Throughout the Bible, what happens when the presence of God comes near to His people? Can you name examples of people who were changed by the presence of God?
