#### REDEEMING THE TIME

Recently, I have had conversations with those who say this has been the fastest passing summer they have ever had. It began with the



close of school for the children, and then, we raced through family vacations, vacation Bible school, a visit to the Ark Encounter and Creation Museum, and summer events like the Fourth of July and lake days. Here we are at the end scratching our heads and wondering, "How?"

But in reality, the summer passed no more quickly than any of the other summers we have ever lived. June and July had the same amount of weeks, days, hours, and minutes, but reality is that we are constantly finding ways to spend that time. Sometimes we expend them in more busyness and sometimes less, but it is all the same time.

As I thought about the disappointment of passing time, I thought of the Apostle Paul's words to both the Ephesian and Colossian churches, "See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, *redeeming the time*, because the days are evil (Ephesians 5:16, Col. 4:5). Though the passages are not completely identical, Paul makes it clear what he means by redeeming the time, and it is not a certain activity that he has in mind. Paul means by "redeeming the time" for us to "walk in the wisdom of the Lord." He calls this in Galatians 5 "walking in the Spirit." Why? Because the days are evil, and the world makes every attempt to rob you of your time that you could spend living in God's will.

The alternative is living every moment of every day walking in God's will. His will may be family vacation, Sunday evening worship, SALT Saturday witnessing, or a walk in the woods, but "redeeming the time" to Paul is nothing else than living out the will of the One who knows all eternity, so that He can lead us into paths of eternal value.
